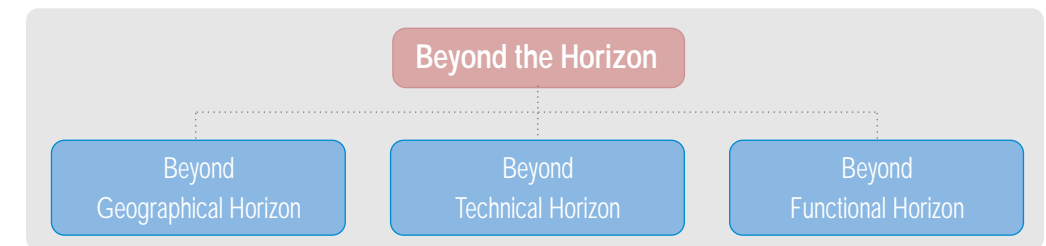

The Scientific Committee of ICPM 2006 welcomes the submission of abstracts for **Poster Presentation**. The deadline for abstract submission is **June 30, 2006**. The presentation will be grouped according to the subject categories listed below:

- 1 Abstracts will only be accepted through the website ([www.icpm2006.org](http://www.icpm2006.org)).
- 2 Deadline for abstract submission is June 30, 2006. Abstract will be peer-reviewed by the Scientific Committee according to subject category and Notification of Acceptance will be sent to the corresponding author by July 31.
- 3 The abstracts must be presented and submitted in English.
- 4 If the abstract must be withdrawn, the author must notify the ICPM 2006 Secretariat via e-mail at [secretariat@icpm2006.org](mailto:secretariat@icpm2006.org) before August 7, 2006.
- 5 Submission of an abstract does not constitute registration for the conference. Presenters are required to register for the conference essentially.

### ■ Abstract Format

- 1 Abstract submission format: MS word only.
- 2 Times New Roman, 10-point font.
- 3 Left margin and do not leave blank lines between paragraphs. Do not indent.
- 4 Content:
  - 1) Title – Title should be in bold. Title should be brief, clearly indicate the content of the abstract.
  - 2) Authors – Full given names should precede the family name. Omit degrees (M.D.). For paper submissions place an asterisk (\*) after the name of the presenting author.
  - 3) Affiliation – On a separate line, type the name of institution and country.
  - 4) Body Text – Leave an empty line before typing the body. Use italics only when appropriate. Simple table and graphs may be included.
- 5 The abstract limit is 2,000 characters including the title, author's name, affiliation, and the text.
- 6 Abstracts will be published as submitted: i.e., any error appearing in the submitted abstract will appear in the published abstract book



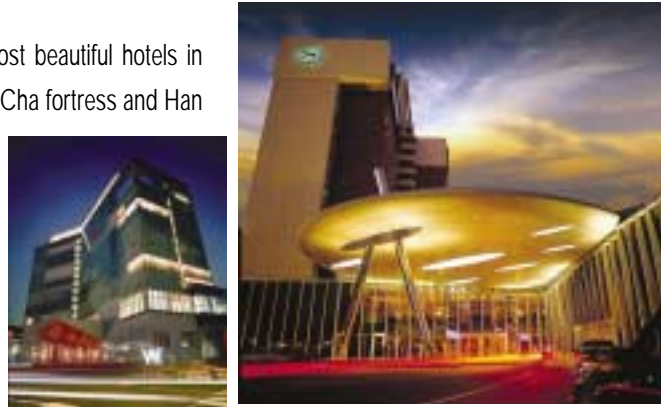

## ■ Airport and Transportation

Participants arriving in Seoul via international flights will mostly enter Korea through Incheon International Airport (ICN). ICN sits at 52 km west of downtown Seoul. The most convenient way to reach the Sheraton Grande Walkerhill is to take the airport limousine which takes approximately 1 hour. ## ■ Passport and Visa

All visitors to the Republic of Korea must have a valid passport and visa. Visitors with roundtrip tickets from countries who have a special agreement with Korea may be exempt from the visa requirement and can stay in Korea visa-free for periods of up to 30 days, or 90 days, depending on the type of agreement between the two countries. When uncertain as to the requirement for entry visa to Korea, please contact the Korean embassy or a consulate as early as possible. ## ■ Climate

Korea's climate is regarded as a continental climate from a temperate standpoint and a monsoon climate from a precipitation standpoint. The climate of Korea is characterized by four distinct seasons: spring, summer, fall and winter. Early September is in the end of summer and the average temperature is generally around 22°C. Participants are recommended to have an umbrella handy in case it rains.

## ■ Currency and Banking

The currency in Korea is the Korean Won (₩). Korean currency notes come in ₩10,000, ₩5,000, and ₩1,000. Coins come in ₩500, ₩100, ₩50 and ₩10 denominations. Credit cards are accepted at most restaurants and shops, the most widely used being VISA, Master, AMEX and Diners Club.

## ■ Electricity

Standard power supply in Korea is 220V/60 Hz (two-pin power outlet).
